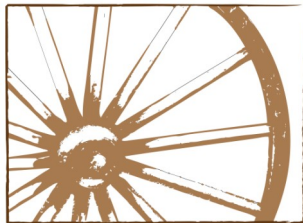
Prizes, demonstrations, interactive events, guided tours, craft projects, and more are planned at each site.
