The Tuskegee Airmen: Myths, Facts, and Legends

Join the History Center at 6 p.m. on Monday, April 27 for a special presentation by noted aviation historian Dr. Daniel Haulman on this famed group of flying men.

The Tuskegee Airmen, known formally as the 332nd Fighter Group, were African Americans who served in a segregated US military during World War II. Despite popular expectations to the contrary, they overcame adversity and proved to be one of the hardest-fighting and most effective fighter groups of the war.



Dr. Daniel L. Haulman has authored several books on the Tuskegee Airmen and serves as the Chief of the Organizational History Division at the Air Force Historical Research Agency, where he has worked since 1982.

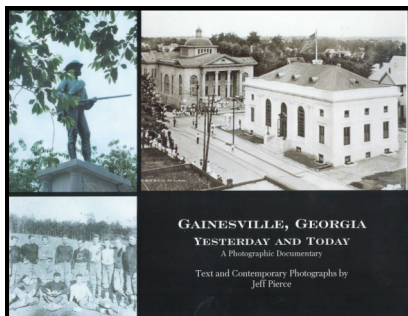

Memorial Day parade for the American Legion. She reads and paints folk art—"it has been called graffiti by a dear friend"—and she even knows how to weave baskets.

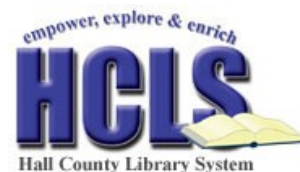
Her advice on raising money: "Don't take it personally when they say no."
