Volunteer Spotlight

After about 10 years in social work, Dee Gillespie decided to return to her first love: history.

And the History Center is one of the beneficiaries. Dee is a member of the center's board of directors, representing the University of North Georgia in Gainesville.

"I convinced myself that I'd never make money as a historian," she said, "so I chose the lucrative field of social work, thinking, oooh, this is going to be the path of luxury and success. It's not."

In her social work, she was a family counselor and, after getting her master's in social work, transitioned into community development.

Today, however, as a professor of U.S. history at UNG, she's helping

students learn history and develop skills that will serve them well in the future. With the emphasis on technology these days, she said, skills in writing and reading sometimes fall by the wayside, skills students learn in history and similar classes.

And "I get paid to read books that I want to read and talk about things I want to talk about," she said.

Dee calls herself an Army brat who moved around with her military family. She finished high school in Maryland, attended undergraduate college at Mount Holyoke in Massachusetts and received her doctorate at Binghamton University in New York.



She teaches four classes every semester, leaving little time for leisure. But she does enjoy taking care of her home, cooking and keeping up with friends.

And she's sold on the importance of the History Center. Just ask her.
