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### **Virtual Tours/Demonstrations Available Live to Classroom**

#### Virtual Option 1 – 1<sup>st</sup> - 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade – 18<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> Century Daily Life Demonstration

Live demonstration of blacksmithing and doing laundry using 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> century methods; applicable to 18th/19th century Native American and European American Daily Life, from the Revolutionary War to the Civil War.

#### Virtual Option 2 – *Land of Promise* Gallery Tour

GPS examples met – 4th Grade: SS4H1, SS4H4 – 5th Grade: SS5H1, SS5G2 – 8th Grade: SS8H1, SS8H3

A live virtual tour broadcast directly to your classroom from the History Center's Land of Promise Gallery. Taking visitors through the history of North Georgia from the original Paleo-Indian inhabitants of 13,000 years ago, through the Mississippian Culture to Cherokee and Creek society, to European exploration and settlement, including African Americans both free and enslaved, the exhibit showcases daily life, as well as cultures and nations in conflict, from the 16<sup>th</sup> century to the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

#### Virtual Option 3 – Historic House and Building Tour

GPS met – 4th Grade: SS4H7 – 5th Grade: SS5H2 – 8th Grade: SS8H7

This live walkthrough of the Whitepath Cabin (built circa 1780 and inhabited through the mid-20<sup>th</sup> century) and the Blacksmith shop (built circa 1880 and used until the 1960s) illustrates daily life of the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> century by examining living and work spaces the people of Northeast Georgia used on a daily basis, comparing and contrasting their ways of life with students' contemporary experience.
